Storage Conditions for Unprocessed Rolls	 When kept in the original packaging: No special conditions are required. Closed transportation packaging items are protected from moisture, heat, and direct sunlight or other sources of ultraviolet UV light. Recommended storage conditions once rolls are removed from the original packaging: Long-term climate-controlled storage conditions are:

Shelf Life of Unprocessed Rolls	It is recommended that the rolls are used within five (5) years of the manufacture date. (NOTE: The recommended "Best before" date and the manufacture date are stated on the carton label.) • Each roll has a lot number imprinted for traceability. Description of Use(s)	The Steriking® Roll Packaging is intended for use as packing material for items by	
	sterilization by steam, or EO gas.	
Preparation for Use	 Roll out packaging to the appropriate length and select the correct width of the item to be packaged. Ensure there is enough room for the package to be sealed without damaging the contents. 	
	2. Cut the packaging from the roll to the desired length.	
	3. Before sealing, remove as much air as possible from the pouch to help prevent rupturing in sterilization.	
	4. Place the proper class of indicator inside the pouch, according to your facility's guidelines.	
	5. Ensure pouch contents and the indicator are away from the seal area and will not get caught in the seal.	
	6. Ensure the proper sealer conditions are used.	
	a. Use a sealer designed for medical packaging.	
	b. Each brand might have a slightly different melting point.	
	c. Be sure to test your brand.	
	7. Confirm the temperature setting on the heat sealer is appropriate for Roll Stock Packaging. Green tinted 165- to 200 °C (329- to 392 °F).	
	8. Leave enough space beyond the seal for the opener to easily grasp; usually up to two (< 2) inches.	

	9. Rubber bands, non-approved tape, safety pins, paper clips, staples, or other sharp objects should not be used to secure packages or to organize the contents.

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Steps for Use of Product	Confirm the temperature setting on the heat sealer is appropriate for Roll
	 Packaging. (Fig.1). Hold the pouch taut (stretched or pulled tight) in the sealer to prevent wrinkles or air bubbles from forming in the seal. (NOTE: If using a rolling-type heat sealer, let the peel pouch move along the guide on its own. (Fig. 2, 3). Once the pouch completes the slide down rolling side, verify the pouch is sealed and that material beyond the seal from the opening is up to two (< 2) inches to allow for aseptic presentation. (Fig. 4). Find the thumb tabs and begin to peel down the seams. (Fig. 5, 6). Continue to roll down the seam, pulling film away from paper. (Fig. 7) Once the top seam is released, open the package using proper aseptic technique. (Fig. 8).

Special Warnings and Cautions	 ♠ Caution: Hot! Be careful not to get burned while using the heat sealer. The Steriking® standard range of packaging is not suitable for sterilization by hot, dry air at temperatures over 140 °C. The seals need to be strong to withstand the most vigorous sterilization process and handling yet providing a clean peel. Closing too strongly should be avoided when sealing rolls, as one of the seals needs to be opened fiber free. (NOTE: A manual test should be carried out to
	 control the seal strength.) Do not use rubber bands, non-approved tape, safety pins, paper clips, staples, or other sharp objects to secure packages or to organize the contents.
